Walks Time Table

Sunday 15th September - Memorial Park Loop 9.30 am

Start at Memorial Park just down from Greenlands Primary School. This walk was one of our Wednesday Evening Walks which people seemed to enjoy. Walk up through the park on Chapman's Well nature reserve. A lovely 7 mile walk that maybe feels a bit longer than what it is.

Sunday 22nd September - Lanchester to Malton with Twist - 9.30am

Start King's Head car park. Walk along Lanchester valley walk and wind through Dorah's wood picking up the trail along to Malton picnic area. Only 3-4 miles this is a nice walk for people new to the group.

Sunday 29th September- Extended Stony Heap Loop 9.30am

Start from the Telescopes. Walk down to Leadgate via C2C track looping around Stony heap and back to the Telescopes. Approximately 7.5 miles.
